Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Again this year, there are two Easters that are far apart. Ours was on March $31^{\rm st}$. The Orthodox Easter is on May $5^{\rm th}$: i.e., more than a month separates them.

Most of us are familiar with the catchy jingle of how we determine Easter in a given year: the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox.

We can also do the arithmetic: addition and long division. Then, determine the Golden Number and the Sunday Letter (BCP, pp. 880-1) and look up the date in the calendar months on BCP pp. 21-2.

Or, we could just do a table look-up, BCP pp. 882-3. Or, we could just Google it! Our Easter can be any day on or after March $22^{\rm nd}$, and on or before April $18^{\rm th}$.

The Orthodox add another 'after': after Passover. This year, Passover begins on the evening of April $22^{\rm nd}$ and runs through April $30^{\rm th}$. The Julian calendar, which the Orthodox use, is not a factor this year.

Today Judaism still uses a lunar calendar for its liturgical year. They have a leap month when they need to get back into sync every 2-3 years. This, of course, places the Orthodox Easter much later than ours (because Passover is much later than usual).

Let's not forget that our calendar is imperfect, too: hence, the leap years we have every four years. Even that is insufficient and must be 'fixed' periodically.

Some years the two Easters do coincide (next in 2025). So, we again celebrate two Easters this year: ours and the Orthodox's. That's not a bad thing. Actually, we could celebrate Easter every day: ie, 365 days of the year. That is how important Jesus' resurrection is. The Church, in its wisdom, reduces it to 50 days, Eastertide, which runs from Easter to Pentecost.
